Classroom News

The short month of December will be busy. We will be working on perfecting the play and practicing the music program every day, as well as making props and scenes on some afternoons. This is a very exciting and exhausting time of year. Please help your child to be successful by making sure they get plenty of sleep. Also remind your child to wash their hands frequently, we need all of our actors to be healthy.

Lower Elementary

In math first graders will be exploring more abstract regrouping subtraction and simple multiplication with the materials. Elapsed time will be one the focus of second grade studies amongst word problems and checker board. Kindergarten will continue the measurements of time with half hour and will be exploring numbers with the one hundred chain. Please keep **practice addition and subtraction facts within 20 (2nd) within 10 (1st)** at home too! Please **read** a lot **during the break.**

<u>In language</u> we will be talking about antonyms and continuing on adjectives, conjunctions, and on blends (in K). Second grade will finish apostrophes and learn more rules of singular and plural forms of words. In writing we will be composing letters to Santa and learning the format of it. K will explore word families, sentences, and heart words.

In Social Studies K will be learning about carnivores / herbivores. Second grade will write more reports about United States' animals and landmarks. We will all learn and review land and water forms.

We will also be talking about December/January holiday celebrations around the world.

We will finish our Great lessons series with exploring different number system and writing numbers from past and present cultures.

Upper Elementary

In Upper Elementary students are excited for winter and looking forward to our Winter Program. In **math**, 3rd graders will be solving multi step word problems and looking at scaled graphs. 4th graders will be working on solving division problems without material and then they will be starting with area and perimeter. 5th graders will be working on multiplying and dividing decimals and fractions. In **ELA**, 3rd graders will be looking at themes of different texts as well as comparing and contrasting these texts. In grammar they will be looking at linking verbs. 4th graders will be looking at how the sequence of events affects a story and looking at graphic features. In grammar they will be looking at adjectives and prepositional phrases. 5th graders will be looking at facts and opinions in different texts as well as drawing conclusions by using text evidence. In grammar they will be continuing their advanced study of verbs. We will be doing fewer spelling and writing lessons during December to allow for enough time for play practice. All students will be sharing their creative writing pieces. **December reading logs will be coming home for students to record books they read at home, these need to be signed and brought back to school when we come back from winter break**. Students will be wrapping up all their work they have done with geography. 3rd graders will finish North/South America and 5th graders Asia/Europe continent activities. 4th graders will be finishing up the Southeast region to complete their knowledge of all 50 state's locations, capitals, and abbreviations.
