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### **Classroom News**



The end of the year is rapidly approaching so we will be getting outside and complementing our studies with real experiences. We will end our Montana studies for lower el. by visiting Nevada City. We will also be going on a hike to identify and classify plants. May will be so much fun! In lower elementary we are at the end of our data analyzing studies, and will concentrate on mastering our Montessori lessons in **math**. Some of us will still have some algebra, probability, and money word problems to work with. We will discover using Roman numerals in the two upper grades. In **language** we will focus on adverbs, homophones, homographs, analogy, and sentence types for older students, and younger students will work on verbs, tenses, predicate and subject, and start long vowel sounds.

In **social sciences** we will start on the study of Montana in all grades and write reports about the state symbols every week, second grade will dive into a bit of Montana history and report on it. We will look at the role of money, goods and services, and talk about consumers and producers. We will watch videos about Montana Indian Tribes and also discuss rights and responsibilities.. In Botany we will read "Shanleya's Quest" to discover classification of plants and play the card game with it. Olders will finish zoology studies of invertebrate animal classes, and K will finish parts of the bird and mammal. We will see what we can accomplish during this last month of school, lots of learning to do, but most of all we will have fun.

For the **summer** please make sure your child is reading every day, practicing typing, writing a journal on your trips and practicing operations (+/-/x) with flashcards! Have a great Summer!

#### **Upper Elementary**

The school year is flying by! Upper Elementary will be busy with field trips in May, including the Farm Fair for 4th and 5th graders. In the classroom, they will be using everything they have learned this year to complete different projects and assignments. In **math**, <u>third graders</u> will be finishing up their material for the year by finding the perimeter and area of different shapes and partitioning them into equal parts. <u>Fourth graders</u> will be finishing by identifying 2D figures and finding symmetry in shapes. <u>Fifth graders</u>, will be analyzing and interpreting expressions as well as looking at coordinate planes. All students will complete the I-Ready Diagnostic Assessment to see their math progress from the beginning of the year.

In **reading**, all grades will be finishing their online Journeys text and vocabulary review. After that, everyone will complete a book study with a book of their choice. This book study will review all the reading and literary terms students learned this year. They will also have a chance to create their own characters in a free-choice writing piece. All students will learn some cursive writing focusing on the letters in their names.
